Erroneous beliefs

- That prayer is more powerful if it is prayed with raw emotion.
- That God will only answer when you pray repeatedly
- You gain special favour from God by identifying more with Jesus when you pray agonised prayers.
- You become more mature the longer you pray for something.
- If you pray like a little child asking again and again and again, eventually the Father will relent and give you what you asked for.

....if a human being, motivated by annoyance rather than friendship, will respond to persistence, then **how much more** will God, who is loving and generous, surely respond to the persistent prayers of His children.

I tell you, even though he will not get up and give you the bread because of friendship, yet because of your shameless **audacity** he will surely get up and give you as much as you need.





God's motivation to answer prayer is not solely based on friendship or familiarity, or on us doing the right things to appease him, but rather on His character as a loving and responsive Father.




Knocking on Heaven's Door
